MV assumed operation of the Microsoft Campus Shuttle in July 2002, and shortly thereafter, MV transformed the service into a fully automated service. Utilizing Microsoft technologies, MV developed a data-driven technological solution geared toward customer satisfaction. For the fixed shuttle portion of this contract, MV established a tool called "The Button" for its fixed shuttle service. Passengers wishing to ride this shuttle press "the button" in order to notify the operator of their presence. If the button is not pushed, the operator knows not to stop.
